



JANUARY 2022 - LEEDS VACCINATION SITES DATES AND TIMES

Walk in clinics are being offered at several locations across Leeds. Details of which vaccines are available and who can attend are included for each listing.

If you need a booster:

- You can book an appointment through the National Booking Service by calling 119 or [booking online](#) for those centres which include this option.
- If you prefer to use a walk-in service, please bear in mind that clinics can be extremely busy and may need to change without notice if they run out of vaccine or can't meet demand. Please be prepared for the weather.

- **Elland Road, Park & Ride Beeston, Leeds LS11 0ES. ([map and directions – opens in Google Maps](#))**
 - Mondays – Sundays: 7:30am – 5:30pm. (This site may close early if there is a football match)
 - Pfizer: 12 – 15 year olds (can have 2nd dose 12 weeks after 1st dose)
 - Pfizer: 16-17 year olds (can have 2nd dose 8 weeks after 1st dose)
 - Pfizer and Moderna: 1st & 2nd doses for 18 year olds and above
 - 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th doses for patients who are immunosuppressed
 - Walk-in booster doses to 40 year olds and above (from 5 -9 January)
 - You can also book an appointment using the [National Booking Service](#) (appointments from 7.30am – 6.30pm)

 - Pfizer: 16 year olds and above, 1st & 2nd doses, boosters, and doses 1-4 for patients who are immunosuppressed

 - Pfizer: 1st, 2nd and booster doses for over 18 year olds



Who can attend these sessions

- Anyone who is eligible (stated in each listing).
- You do not need to have an NHS number or be registered with a GP.
- Anyone over the age of 16 can have their second dose 8 weeks following their first dose. Children aged 12 – 15 can receive a second dose 12 weeks following their first dose. Getting the second dose is vital to getting longer lasting protection, and is especially important to help protect you against new variants.
- You need to have had two doses and wait 3 months before you can have a booster.
- If you have already booked an appointment for a later date, you can still get vaccinated at a walk-in clinic but please make sure you cancel your booked appointment so someone else can use it. *Please note that walk-in clinics may be very busy and you might have to queue.*

About the walk-in clinics

- Clinics will be on a first come, first served basis. There may be queues at busy times so people should come prepared for the weather and bring a drink of water. You will also need a mask or face covering.
- If there is high demand and supplies are used up, clinics may have to close early.
- People who already have an appointment booked at a site offering walk-in vaccines should still attend at their timed slot and they will receive their vaccine as planned. Appointments can still be [booked by clicking here](#) or by calling 119.
- You are welcome to ask a member of staff any questions about the vaccine before having it.
- You can book your second dose on the national booking service 24 hours after your first dose. (Visit www.nhs.uk/CovidVaccination or call 119.)
- In line with the latest guidance from the Joint Committee for Vaccinations and Immunisations, people aged 39 and under and all pregnant women will be offered the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine.
- If you are having a second dose, this will usually be the same vaccine you had for your first vaccination.
- If you are immunosuppressed you can walk-in for your doses where listed above.
